

in the State of Maryland, beginning at the end of the north line of part of a tract of land  
called Dubany's lot lately sold and conveyed to Nicholas Gringle by the execution of the  
will and Testament of William Pratty deceased by deed dated on or about the twenty  
of May instant and adjoining thereto with the said and the then following several  
and distinct No 9<sup>th</sup> degree West ten Perches to a Stake standing on the ground line of  
two hundred and thirty two and one half acres part of Dubany's lot laid off for the  
aforesaid William Pratty then No 68<sup>th</sup> degree East twenty six Perches to a Stake  
standing at the end of forty six Perches on the fourteenth line of a tract of land  
called the Plow then with said line South twenty three degrees West 4<sup>th</sup> Perches  
a Stone planted for the beginning of six acres part of said Dubany's lot which was  
conveyed by Edward Salmon to the aforesaid William Pratty by deed dated on  
about the 19 April 1798 then by a straight line to the place of beginning containing  
one and three quarters of an acre and seven ten Perches which is part to be held  
to confiscation. The Board agreed to sell the State's right to said land for the  
sum of four pounds fifteen shillings current Money.

Robert Emory was appointed an associate Justice for Queen Anne's County  
and Henry Sardin resigned, and Commission issued to Jonathan Brady and  
Robert Emory as associate Justices of the said County.

John Hoffman was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Frederick County  
and Thomas Gringle resigned and a new Commission issued to the said  
County including him.

John Williams was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Somerset County  
and a new Commission issued to the said County including him.

Resolved that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas Pennington the  
sum of twenty four pounds for one quarter Salary as Clerk of the Council on the  
day.

Resolved that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant John  
Huffman fifteen pounds for one quarter half pay due as above.

Resolved that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Samuel Swann  
the sum of fifteen pounds for one quarter half pay due as above.

Resolved that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel John H.  
Stuart forty two pounds three shillings and nine pence for one quarter half  
pay due as above.

Resolved that the said Treasurer pay to William Harwood Esquire twenty  
eight pounds two shillings and six pence for one quarter Salary as Clerk of  
the House of Delegates due as above.
