Resolved that the Governor and Council be and they are hereby requested to transmit to the House the following letters on the subject of the Bank Stock in England

a letter from Saml Chase to the Governor dated 22 March 1802

From same to same dated 13 Feb. 1802

From same to same dated 24 Dec. 1802

From Wm Pinney to the Secretary of State of the U. States 22 Oct. 1803

From same to the Governor of Maryland dated 20 Sep. 1803

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonathan Pinney Esquire, seventeen pounds four shillings and nine pence for articles furnished the Council as per account paid.

Samuel Tyler Esquire was appointed a Justice of the orphans Court for Prince Georges County vice Benjamin Machall removed and commission issued to Samuel Tyler, Thomas F. Brooke and Benjamin Odum as Justices of the orphans Court for said County.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Negro Moses out of the Contingent Fund one pound two shillings and six pence for clearing out the Public Millery as per account paid.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Samuel Guin Esquire, twenty eight dollars and twenty cents and one half for Postages for the Governor & as per account.
