

Instruments, containing the number of Votes for Electors for the purposes aforesaid in said act, should
enumerate and ascertain the number of votes for each and every candidate and person so as
aforesaid, polled and voted for as an Elector, respectively, and should thereupon declare by Proclamation
signed by the Governor, and without delay dispense through the State, the name of the person duly
elected as Elector in each respective district. We in pursuance of the directions of the said act, do
by this our Proclamation declare that by the Returns made to us, it appears that John Parham,
Esquire, is elected an Elector for the first district: Joseph Wilkinson, Esquire, for the second
district: John Johnson and Edward Johnson, Esquires, for third district: John Tyler and
Frederick Chapman, Esquires, for the fourth district: Tobias E. Stansbury for the fifth district: John
Gibson Esquire, for the sixth district: William Graves Esquire, for the seventh district: Perry
Spencer Esquire, for the eighth district and Ophraim King Wilson for the ninth district.

Given in Council at the City of Annapolis under the Seal of the State of Maryland this third
day of December in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four.
