The Council met. Present The Honorable Richard Hall Harwood, Allen. B. Suckett and  
Reverdy Phiselen

The following persons were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco at the respective Warehouses in  
Baltimore County to wit. at Falls Point Warehouse Nicholas Ridgely. at the Head of the  
Bason Vachel Sorey. at Lagan and Bonalls New Warehouse Josias Stevenson.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honorable Sumner Towley Chase the  
sum of two thousand dollars for one years Salary as Judge of the General Court due the first  
day of November last.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to the honorable John Bone five hundred dollars for  
one quarters Salary as Judge of the General Court due the first day of February last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Pory Benson twenty  
two pounds ten Shilling for one quarters half pay due as above.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Mrs Ann Swacher fifteen pounds for one  
quarters half pay due as above.

Ordered that one hundred and fifty dollars of the Contingent Fund be appropriated  
to repairing the Council Room and the Furniture thereof

By the Petition of Barbara Portman of Frederick County accompanied by a  
Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that she was  
fined by the said Court at February Term last the quantity of six hundred pounds of  
Tobacco for selling Spirituous liquor without License. The Petitioner states that being old  
and unable to work at any kind of labour that requires much strength he was prevailed on  
by a number of respectable persons in her Neighborhood to retail Spirituous liquors as the  
means of obtaining an honest livelihood. That being ignorant and knowing nothing of
