

Ordered, that fifty dollars be appropriated out of the Contingent Fund to repairing the land office under the direction of the Register and that Mr. John Shaw be employed.

Ordered, that eighty dollars be appropriated out of the Contingent Fund to repairing the Chancery office under the direction of the Register and that Mr. James Luby be employed to do the same.

Ordered, by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant John Lynn the sum of forty five pounds for nine months half pay due the first day of February last.

Ordered, that Joseph Hopper Nicholson be appointed Agent for disposing of the Stock belonging to the State of Maryland in the Funds of England and for investing the proceeds thereof in Stock of the United States in virtue of certain Resolutions of the General Assembly at their last Session, and the act of a Assembly entitled an act relative to the Stock of the Bank of England, belonging to the State of Maryland, provided that the said Joseph Hopper Nicholson enter into contract agreeably to the provisions of the act of a Assembly aforesaid, and give Bond with sufficient security to be approved of by the Governor and Council on or before the first day of May next.

Ordered, that Mr. John Shaw be directed to make a lease for the Council Room and that fifty dollars of the Contingent Fund be appropriated for that purpose.
