The Petitioner states that during the holy day of Whit Sunday in the Year 1804, there was a cock Fight in an old Field, about three quarters of a Mile from the dwelling of your Petitioner, and some of the persons there assembled anxiously wishing to have a little refreshment during their diversion, this not knowing that it was contrary to law she sent her Son a young Man, to the place with some Cakes and a Gallon of Whiskey to sell... hoping thereby to raise a little Money for the benefit of her Children... very little sum of Money however trifling such sum might be, being of consequence to a person uncircumstanced as she is. That her Son, Thomas C. Rockhold did sell the said Gallon of Whiskey at her request, and in consequence thereof was presented at the subsequent County Court, and at the last Session of said Court, in April Instant, the usual fine was imposed on his submission of the case to the Court: and this fine, with all the necessary costs therunto appertaining, must inevitably fall upon the Petitioner, as the said Thomas C. Rockhold is unable to pay the same, and in fact did transgress against the law, tho' ignorantly, and without wil intention, at her request, and solely with a view of benefitting himself and family. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine
