The Council met Pursuant The Honble Richard Hall Harwood, Allen B. Duckitt and Oswald Chesiden.

By the Petition of John Miller Junior of Calvert County accompanied by Transcripts from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that at April Term 1802 he was a joint Security with Dennis Sullivan for a certain Edward Griffin of George Town, on three different presentments at the said Term for selling Liquors without License. That the said Edward Griffin and Dennis Sullivan, have both since cleared out under the Act of Insolvency by which means the Petitioner has now become solely answerable for the full amount of the sum aforesaid, which he is totally unable to pay, being now upwards of fifty Years of age, with five children to maintain and support, and with but very small property to do it on. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do release the said John Miller Junior, from the payment of eighteen pounds being the whole amount of the said fines.

By the Petition of Samuel Wolf of Calvert County it appears that he became bound in a Recognizance in the sum of twenty five pounds for the appearance of a certain Allen Bidder to answer a presentment against him for assaulting a certain Gauntlet Fry at April Term 1802. The Petitioner states that there were also Civil Suits between the parties and the said Bidder and Fry agreed at Lower Marlboro' to settle their differences during the Term at which the said Bidder ought to have appeared. The Petitioner further states that he was under the impression that the settlement, between the parties released him from all liability, and of course took no steps to bring the said Bidder to Court. The Petitioner states that if the said forfeiture is enforced, it will be very burthensome to him as he is in narrow circumstances. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture.
