

On the application of James Hood of Shen of Baltimore County for a preference in the purchase of a tract of land called Blooming Plains said to contain eight hundred and fifty four acres late the property of Thomas French which is said to be liable to confiscation. The Board agreed to sell the State right to the said tract of land to said Hood for the sum of one dollar per acre. The said Hood to give bond with approved security. The said sum of one dollar per acre to be independent of the one third part of the value of the said tract of land. The credit to be until the twentieth day of October in the year eight hundred and six.

The Council sold the State right to the foregoing lands for the sum of twelve hundred and thirty six pounds seven shillings and seven pence half penny current Money to George French provided he give bond with such security as the Treasurer may approve on or before the first day of November next, conditioned for the payment of four hundred and twelve pounds one shilling and ten pence half penny on or before the twelfth day of June eight hundred and six - and for the payment of the further sum of four hundred and twelve pounds one shilling and ten pence half penny on or before the twelfth day of February eight hundred and seven. and for the payment of the further sum of four hundred and twelve pounds one shilling and ten pence half penny on or before the twelfth day of October eight hundred and seven. Interest on the whole sum of twelve hundred and thirty six pounds seven shillings and seven pence half penny from this day until the first Instalment with Interest is discharged, and then on the second and third Instalments from the payment of the first Instalment and Interest, and then on the third Instalment from the payment of the second Instalment with Interest.
