The Council met Present The Honble Allen Bowie Esq. Richard T. Clark
Francis Biggs and Philip Rud.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Messieurs Pinkney
and Munroe thirteen pounds fifteen shillings and three pence half penny out
of the Contingent Fund for Articles furnished for the use of the Council as per
Account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Jonathan Pinkney Esquire
eight pounds fourteen shillings and seven pence half penny for Articles
furnished for the use of the Council as per account passed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lazarus Hammond
fifteen pounds for one year half pay due the first day of November last.

By the Petition of Sabina Tyson it appears that Henry Tyson her husband
in the month of January 1805 entered into a Recognizance in the sum of fifty
pounds at the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for Baltimore
County for the appearance of Patrick Flinn to stand his trial on a charge of
felony exhibited against him by a certain William Schoff. The Petitioner
states that the said Henry Tyson was induced to enter into the Recognizance from
his long acquaintance with the said Flinn whom he always considered an
honest and industrious Man and of whose innocence of the said charge he had
and still has the firmest reliance. That the said Patrick Flinn did not make
his appearance agreeably to the tenor of his Recognizance which was accordingly
