

The Petitioner states that he was altogether unacquainted with the provisions of the act of Assembly of nineteen hundred and fifteen Chapter ten relating to the Standard of Weights and measures: and in common with his Neighbours, from the circumstances aforesaid, he had neglected to have his measure tried by the Standard and stamped. The Petitioner further states that when the said measure was tried with the Standard: that it contained more than was required by law. that the fine being fixed by law the Court could not reduce it. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.

By the Petition of Ephraim Wilson of George of Somerset County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by Somerset County Court at May Term eighteen hundred and five the sum of five pounds for selling one Pint of Spirit on Monday the twelfth day of November eighteen hundred and four without License. The Petitioner states that on the seventh day of October eighteen hundred and four he purchased of a certain Isaac Sterling of said County the remains of his Store goods which consisted partly of dry goods and partly of Groceries. that he also took the House in which the said Goods were kept, together with the said Sterling's License for retailing liquors. that believing he had a right to sell the same liquors under said Sterling's License, and confident that there was no fraud on the State nor any intended, he proceeded to sell under said License, until the Session of the next Court which happened in November, at which time he took out a License in his own name. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.

Marshall Parker was appointed Coroner for Calvert County and Commission issued to him accordingly.

The Board provided to elect a Chief Judge for the first District in the room of the honorable Richard Sprigg deceased, and the Ballots being deposited in the Ballot Box and on examination thereof it appeared that the honorable John Marshall Gantt was elected. Whereupon it is declared in the Council that the said John Marshall Gantt is duly elected Chief Judge of the said District.

The Board provided to elect an Associate Judge for the first Judicial District in the room of John Marshall Gantt who is appointed Chief Judge, and the Ballots being deposited in the Ballot Box and on examination thereof it appeared that Samuel Clarke Esquire had a Majority of Votes. Whereupon it is declared in the Council that the said Samuel Clarke is duly elected Associate Judge of the said District.
