

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Aaron Swisher the sum of fifteen pounds for one quarters half pay due the first Instant.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. John Brown twenty eight pounds two shillings and six pence for one quarters salary as Clerk of the House of Delegates due as above.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. Subb Fowler twenty nine pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence for one quarters salary as Mesenger of the Council and of oath due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain James Bruff twenty two pounds ten shillings for one quarters half pay due the first day of November last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honorable Thomas W. Hall eight pounds six shillings and eight pence for salary due as a Member of the Council to the first Instant.

By the Petition of Samuel Grace of Baltimore County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and of Oath for the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March Term last in four several Presentments for selling spirituous Liquor without License. The Petitioner states that he is a hard labouring Man and is struggling to provide for himself and a numerous family. That he opened a small Grocery Store which he committed to the charge and management of his Wife, whilst he himself is constantly engaged in attending to his Vessel either in repairing loading or sailing them up and down the Bay. That all the above presentments were found on account of his Wife having sold Liquor in his absence contrary to Law. That the payment of the fines and costs would be ruinous to him. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
