The Council met. Present The Honble Rowdy Ghiesdin, Richard Tighman Clerk, Francis Biggs and Thomas W. Hall.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Honble Francis Biggs, fifty pounds for one quarter salary as a Member of the Council due the first Instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Honble Richard Tighman Clerk the sum of fifty pounds for one quarter salary as a Member of the Council due the fifteenth day of May last.

Robert Emory was appointed a Justice of the Orphans Court for Lunenburg County in the room of Colonel William Hopper deceased and Commission accordingly issued to Philip Fiddemon, John Brown and Robert Emory as Justices of the Orphans Court for said County.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mrs. Rebecca Trust Ninety Dollars for one quarter half pay due the first day of May last.

The Council met. Present The Honble Richard Tighman Clerk, Francis Biggs, Philip Reed, and Thomas W. Hall

By the Petition of Jonathan Russell of Dochester County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of twenty pounds for the appearance of a certain Thomas Marshall at October Term eight hundred and three to answer for a faulting Samuel Beuff. That the said Marshall did appear at the said and two other Terms. That the said Samuel Beuff the Statute Witness never having appeared at either of the said Terms the said Marshall considered himself as discharged from the Recognizance. That at March Term eight hundred and seven the Recognizance was declared to be forfeited. That the said Marshall not having any visible property whereby the said forfeiture can be paid, the petitioner is subjected to the payment of the same. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture.
