

Friday October the 17. 1806

The Council met. Present The Honble Rowdy Ghieslin, Francis Siggis, Philip Reid and Thomas W. Hall.

The Council appointed Mr. Subb Fowler to purchase Wood for the use of the General Assembly and allowed him ten per Centum for the same. Therefor ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore advance to the said Subb Fowler three hundred Dollars for the above purpose.

Saturday October the 18. 1806

The Council met. Present The Honble Rowdy Ghieslin, Francis Siggis, Philip Reid and Thomas W. Hall

The Board proceeded to elect an Attorney General of the State of Maryland in the room of John Thompson Mason Esquire, resigned, and the Ballots being deposited in the Ballot Box and on examination there of it appeared that John Johnson Esquire got every Vote. Whereupon it is declared in the Council that the said John Johnson is duly elected Attorney General of the State of Maryland.

John Harwood was appointed Notary Public for the State of Maryland to reside at the Town of Carston in Talbot County in the room of Philimon P. A. Lowrie who refused to accept and Commission issued to him accordingly.

The Board received the Return of the Sheriff's election from Worcester County declaring Joshua Burr and Levin Duverson duly elected. Commission issued accordingly to Joshua Burr as Sheriff of the said County.

The Board received the Return of the Sheriff's election from Somerset County declaring Daniel Ballard and Tubman Lewis duly elected. Commission issued accordingly to Daniel Ballard as Sheriff of the said County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Edward Roberts, the sum of twenty five Dollars, for riding Express to the honble Richard Elghman Esq. as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered that Mr. Nathan Lanning be directed to send by Captain John Barber to the City of Annapolis three Barrels of the Powder belonging to the State now under his care.

Monday October the 20. 1806

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Rowdy Ghieslin, Francis Siggis, Richard Elghman Esq. and Thomas W. Hall

The Board received the Return of the Sheriff's Election from Allegany County declaring William Bruce and William Hillary duly elected. Commission issued accordingly to William Bruce as Sheriff of the said County.

The Board took into consideration the account of John Gwin Esquire, Clerk of the late General Court for the Western Shore for duties performed under and by virtue of the Act to provide for the organization and regulation of the Courts of Common Law in this State, and for the administration of Justice therein and agreed to allow him the sum of one thousand Dollars and no more for the same. Whereupon ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the said John Gwin two hundred Dollars it being the balance due him after deducting the eight hundred Dollars that were advanced him by order of the Executive on the sixth day of September last.
