The Council met. Present The Honble Oswald G. Childen, Richard Telford, and Francis Digges. J. H.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore be directed not to bring suit against Benjamin Ray late Sheriff of Montgomery County until after the first day of December next.

Saturday October the 25 1806

The Council met. Present The Honble Oswald G. Childen, Francis Digges and Thomas W. Hall.

The Board received the Returns of the Sheriff election from Calvert County declaring George W. Ireland and John Sedgwick duly elected. Commission issued accordingly to George W. Ireland Esquire, as Sheriff of the said County.

The Board being in possession of the Returns from the Counties of Queen Anne, Talbot and Caroline of an election held for the choice of a Representative of the seventh District in the Congress of the United States to supply the vacancy occasioned by the Resignation of the Honble Joseph Hopper Nicholson by which it appears that the Honble Edward Lloyd was elected. Therefore it is declared that the said Edward Lloyd is duly elected a Representative of this State in the Congress of the United States. Given in Council, at the City of Annapolis, under the Seal of the State of Maryland, this twenty fifth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six. Which was sent to the Honble the Secretary of State of the United States.

The Board being in possession of the Returns from the several Counties of this State of the election lately held for the choice of Representatives in the Congress of the United States, provided according to the direction of the act of Assembly in such case made and provided, to innumerate and ascertain the Votes given for each person voted for as aforesaid: when it appeared that John Campbell, Archibald Van Horn, Philip Barton Key, Roger Nelson, Nicholas Quant Moore, William M. Curry, John Montgomery, Edward Lloyd, and Charles Goldsborough, Esquires had the greatest number of Votes: Wherefore it is hereby certified and declared that the said John Campbell, Archibald Van Horn, Philip Barton Key, Roger Nelson, Nicholas Quant Moore, William M. Curry, John Montgomery, Edward Lloyd, and Charles Goldsborough, Esquires, are duly elected Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States. Given in Council, at the City of Annapolis under the Seal of the State of Maryland, this twenty fifth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six. Which was sent to the Honble the Secretary of State of the United States.

A Proclamation

Whereas the General Assembly of Maryland did, by an act, passed at November Session, eight hundred and five, entitled "an act to reduce into one the several acts of Assembly, respecting elections, and to regulate said elections," direct that the Governor and Council after having received the Returns of elections of the Members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States should innumerate
