That as soon as she was informed that she could not obtain the House of Mr. Hartman she applied to her son to John Marshall Gantt, Esquire, then Chief Justice of the County Court for a Permit which was refused Mr. Gantt requiring her personal Application who was at that time so much indisposed that she could not leave home. She therefore prays a Remission of the said fine. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit five of the said fine amounting to thirty pounds.

Ordered, that the Proceedings of the Council shall be regularly entered on a Journal each day, and that on the succeeding day previous to any other act, the same shall be read over by the Clerk, and signed by the Governor, or the Member of the Council presiding, before which any Member may move to reconsider any part thereof which may not have been carried into execution and the same shall be considered as subject to alteration by a subsequent vote of the Council.

The Board appointed Samuel Miller, Patrick Ewing, John I. Cox, Edward H. Veazey, Captain John Evans of Robert, William Hollingsworth and Fussy Henderson were appointed Justices of the Levy Court for Cecil County and a Commission issued to them accordingly.

Sidney Gorge, Thomas Maffett and John Gilpin were appointed Justices of the Apprais Court for Cecil County and Commission issued to them accordingly.

The Council postponed the further consideration of Justices of the Peace and other officers of annual Appointment until to Morrow.
