The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honourable Rowdy G. Chesler, Thomas W. Hall and Lewis Duwall.

William Thompson Lee was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Saint Marys County and Commission issued to the said County including him and leaving out John Stone and James Egerton Esquires resigned.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore advance to Mr. Subl Fowler fifty Dollars to purchase Wood for the use of the State to be by him accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Kelly Esquire, Register of the Land Office the sum of thirty Dollars as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. Abraham Gambel nine pounds for one years half pay due the first day of February last.

A Proclamation

By His Excellency Robert Wright Esquire Governor of Maryland

Whereas it has been represented to me that on the Night of the nineteenth of March last. two Barns, two Corn Houses, a Granary and a Stable with one hundred and twenty Barrels of Corn, a few Bushels of Wheat, an Horse, and a variety of Farming Utensils the property of John Moore Esquire a Justice of the Peace for West County, by some unknown Incendiary or Incendiaries were consumed by Fire: And Whereas it has also been represented to me by a number of respectable Inhabitants of said County, that they verily believe that the said Incendiary or Incendiaries has or have been induced to perpetrate the said outrage on the property of said John Moore Esquire, from his vigilance and assiduity in the discharge of the duties of his said office: And Whereas it is the duty of the Executive in the execution of the Law to endeavour to bring all Malefactors to Justice. I have therefore thought proper to issue this my Proclamation, and do by and with the advice and consent of the
