

said part, at a stone formerly placed and proved as the beginning of that part of the aforesaid land called Tasker's Chance belonging to and in possession of Jacob Bontz, and running thence westerly of the given line of said part, North sixty three and a half degrees West one hundred and sixty Perches to the end of the fifth and last line of said Jacob Bontz's part, which calls to the north line of Tasker's Chance then with said north line of said land westerly by its most ancient location, as held and possessed by the parties interested answering to an allowance of four and a half degrees for variation on the line thereof, South sixty and one half degrees East one hundred and thirty Perches to the beginning of said north line, then by a straight line to the first mentioned beginning stone, containing the quantity of four and a half acres of land, which is said to be liable to confiscation. The Board agreed to sell the State right to said Parcel of land for such sum as should hereafter be ascertained and determined on, and it is hereby ordered that Samuel Dwall Esquire, Surveyor of Frederick County be appointed to value the same.

By the Petition of Thomas D. Moreland of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was found at September Term last twenty five Dollars for assaulting and beating Catharine Anderson on or about the first of November eighteen hundred and five. The Petitioner states that the prosecution was supported by the testimony of the said Catharine Anderson - there being no other witness sworn to the Jury, as the only witness of whose testimony the Petitioner could avail himself, had died a short time before the trial. The Petitioner states that the said Catharine Anderson, is a Woman of infamous character and conceiving herself to be interested in the event of the prosecution, grossly misrepresented his conduct. that he has a large family and being in indigent circumstances cannot without great injury to them pay the fine imposed upon him. The Board on consideration of the circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit twenty Dollars of the said fine.
