By the Petition of Stephen Rumrill of the City of Annapolis accompanied by Transcripts from the Proceedings of Anne Arundel County Court it appears that he was fined by the Court of the said County at April Term last the sum of sixty five Dollars for sundry Assaults and Batteries. The Petitioner states that the said Assaults and Batteries were committed by him in his own defence which he could have proved to the satisfaction of the said Court. but being an illiterate person and totally unacquainted with Court Affairs did not know the necessity of producing a Witness in Court. The Petitioner further states that none of the persons for whom he was fined in the said Case of Assault and Battery received the smallest injury whatever. That he is in indigent circumstances and has a large family who are entirely dependant on him for their daily maintenance and support. The Board on consideration of his family and the very narrow state of his circumstances and from the recommendation of a number of his Neighbours do release the said Stephen Rumrill from the said fines on his paying thirty Dollars and Costs of Prosecution.
