Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Honourable Beverly Ghindin one hundred pounds for half year Salary due the first Instant.

Ordered by the Governor that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant John Truman fifteen pounds for one quarter half pay due as above.

By the Petition of Henry Shock of Baltimore County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that on the fiftenth day of July in the Year eighteen hundred and four he entered into a Recognizance before William Russell Esquire one of the Justices of the Peace for the County of Baltimore County in the sum of ten pounds Current Money to appear before the Court of the said County on the first Monday in November then next following to testify against a certain John Shelton for stealing from the Petitioner. The Petitioner states that he did appear at the said Court and did testify to the Grand Jury, that the said Grand Jury did not send any Bill of Indictment against the said John Shelton, and that his Recognizance was discharged at the said Court. That the Petitioner being a Sea faring Man and not knowing that it was necessary to have his Recognizance discharged after he had testified to the Grand Jury neglected the same and departed to Sea; and never knew
