

On the second Monday in November and ninth day of the same Month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seven the General Assembly of Maryland agreeably to the Constitution and Form of Government, proceeded to the choice of a Governor when Robert Wright Esquire was elected and immediately qualified, in the Senate Room, in presence of the Members of both Houses of the Legislature, by taking the several Oaths prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State and by making and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, as also an oath to support the Constitution of the United States

on Tuesday following and tenth day of the same Month the General Assembly proceeded to the choice of the Council to the Governor when James Butcher, Lewis Duwall, Thomas W. Hall, Reverdy G. Chislin and James Nabbs Esquire were elected.

Thursday November the 12. 1807

James Butcher, Lewis Duwall and Thomas W. Hall Esquire, Councillors elect, appeared in the Council Room, and were qualified as such agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of this State, before Richard Murchin Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking, repeating and subscribing the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose, as also by taking the oath of support to the Government of the United States. The Council met pursuant His Excellency the Governor and the Honble James Butcher, Lewis Duwall and Thomas W. Hall Ninian Pinney were appointed Clerk of the Council and qualified before Richard Murchin Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County by taking repeating and subscribing the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose, and also by taking the oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

Mr. Tubb Fowler was appointed Messenger to the Council

Friday November the 13. 1807

The Honourable Reverdy G. Chislin a Councillor elect appeared in the Council Room and was qualified as such agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of this State before Richard Murchin, Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking, repeating and subscribing the several Oaths and the Declaration prescribed for that purpose as well as the oath of support to the Government of the United States. Certificate thereof filed. The Council met pursuant the honourable Lewis Duwall, Thomas W. Hall and Reverdy G. Chislin.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Samuel Green Esquire four hundred and six Dollars and forty four cents for Postage for the Executive as per Account papered.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to the honourable Reverdy G. Chislin the sum of fifty pounds for one quarter Salary as a Member of the Council due the first Instant

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to the honourable James Nabbs the sum of fifty pounds for one quarter Salary as a Member of the Council due as above.
