The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honourable Lewis Duwall Reverdy G. Bushin and Thomas W. Hall.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Nicholas White the sum of ninety six pounds for six Months Salary as Annoucer at Frederick Town due the first Instant.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Captain Nicholas White the sum of two hundred and forty four Dollars and ninety one cents as per account passed by the Auditor.

Levin W. Ballard and John Williamson were appointed Justices of the Peace for Calvert County and Commission issued to William Somerwell, Theodore Hodgkin, Richard Ireland Junr, Charles Gantt, Benjamin H. Marshall, Cosmo M. Hargie, Joshua Sedwick, James Mossell, Thomas H. Lyle, Philip Dofey, Robert Free land, Joseph Griff, J. Samuel Wood, Watter Greenfield, Edmund Albright, Richard Roberts, Sutton Isaac Weems, Gideon Ireland, Nathaniel Weems, Joseph Lanier, Levin W. Ballard and John Williamson as Justices of the Peace for said County.

By the Petition of Thomas Armstrong accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for Baltimore County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March Term eighteen hundred and eight four Dollars and six hundred weight of Tobacco for selling liquor without licence. The Petitioner states that he has been a Tavern Keeper in Baltimore County for several years past and had been using in the habit of taking out his licence at the November Term of the Court. that in the year eighteen hundred and six he obtained his licence at the November Term and at the November Session of a Assembly held in that year the November Term of the Court was adjourned to the 15th of November of which he was not informed until November of eighteen hundred and six when he was about applying as usual. that in consequence of this he did not appear at the Court he was led into the error by which the fine was imposed.
