Monday August the 15 1808

The Council met Present the Honourable Lewis Duwall, Thomas W. Hall and Reverdy Gwynne.

Tuesday August the 16 1808

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honourable James Butcher, Lewis Duwall, Thomas W. Hall and Reverdy Gwynne.

By the Petition of Charles Randall of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript of the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he entered as Security at a prior Term eighteen hundred and seven for three fines of sixty Dollars each that were imposed on Roger M. Blain, John Roney and Jeremiah Sullivan for committing a Riot. The Petitioner states that at the time of his entering security as aforesaid, he was one of the Undertakers to pave part of the Baltimore and Frederick Town Turnpike Road and that they were employed with him, that he was induced to become security on a promise from them to work the fines out with him, that shortly afterwards, and before they had earned any part of the said fines, they all left him and are gone he knows not where. The Petitioner further states that he has considerably by his Contract for work on the aforesaid Road by which his circumstances have become much embarrassed, and he rendered incapable of discharging the fines without depriving himself of the necessary articles for carrying on his business. The Board on consideration of the circumstances and from the recommendation of a number of respectable persons inhabitants of Baltimore and Anne Arundel Counties do remit the said three fines of sixty Dollars each.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Frederick Green the sum of twenty seven pounds one shilling and ten pence half penny as per account papered.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. William Tuck the sum of five hundred and thirty Dollars in full of his account for work done in the House of Delegates Room.
