The Board being in possession of the Returns from the several Counties of this State of the election lately held for the choice of Representatives in the Congress of the United States, proceeded agreeably to the direction of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, to enumerate and ascertain the votes given for each person voted for as aforesaid: when it appeared that John Campbell, Archibald Van Horn, Philip Barton Key, Roger Nelson, Nicholas Ruston Moore, Alexander McMillin, John Montgomery, John Brown, of Nathan, and Charles Goldbrough, Esquires, had the greatest number of votes: Wherefore it is hereby certified and declared that the said John Campbell, Archibald Van Horn, Philip Barton Key, Roger Nelson, Nicholas Ruston Moore, Alexander McMillin, John Montgomery, John Brown of Nathan and Charles Goldbrough, Esquires, are duly elected Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States. Given in Council, at the City of Annapolis, under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland the twentieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight, and of the independence of the United States of America the thirty third.
