On the second Monday in November and fourteenth day of the same Month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight the General Assembly of Maryland agreeably to the Constitution and Form of Government, proceeded to the choice of a Governor when Robert Wright Esquire was re-elected, and immediately qualified in the Senate Room, in presence of the Members of both Houses of the Legislature, by taking the several oaths prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State and by making and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, as also an oath to support the Constitution of the United States.
