Monday January the 2 1809

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable Reverdy G. Huselin, Lewis Duwall and Benjamin Hodges.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. George Betts the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars it being the Reward offered by His Excellency's Proclamation dated the twentieth day of October last for the apprehending a certain Thomas Burk.

Ordered that Mr. Robert Welch of Benjamin be authorized and requested to take all steps which may be necessary for recovering and collecting the Public Arms and Accoutrements that have been at any time delivered to Colonel William D. Beall, Captain William Carey, Captain James Hoban and Mr. James M. Lingan as the property of the State of Maryland, and pass a receipt for the same which shall be sufficient to exonerate those who may be now chargeable therewith, and the said Robert Welch of Ben is hereby authorized to transport the said Arms when collected to this place in such manner as he may think best.

Ordered that Mr. Robert Welch of Ben be authorized and he is hereby requested to take all steps which may be necessary for recovering and collecting the two Iron Field Pieces that were loaned by the Executive to Mr. Cornelia Mills on the twenty first day of December fourteen hundred and ninety five for the use of an Artillery Company in the City of Washington and pass a receipt for the same.
