Ordered that the Executive will take of Mr. David Armour one thousand Cartouch Boxes of the quality of the Pattern left at one hundred and sixty one cents each delivered by the first of April at Annapolis.

By the Petition of Agnes M. Gowen of Washington City it appears that she was fined in two several cases for selling Spirituous liquor without licence. The Petitioner states that in order to obtain an honest livelihood she has hitherto kept a Boarding house for the accommodation of day labourers who were employed in the neighbourhood where she resides. That about the time of the building of the Union Bank a large number of the Workmen engaged in that Building boarded at her house in consequence of its vicinity to their business. That these persons bought their liquor in the morning left it at their lodgings and as occasion required in the course of the day went in and drank. But finding it inconvenient for each person to purchase his own liquor and to preserve it in different Bottles - they requested the Petitioner to purchase as much as would serve them all, and promised to repay her whatever it might cost. The Petitioner states that she never sold to any person except those who boarded with her. That she received no profit on what she did sell. That it was merely done to accommodate her boarders upon the continuance of whose favor depended her daily subsistence. That she was utterly unable to pay the fines and unless they are remitted she must expiate her offence in Jail. The Board in consideration of the circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines
