Friday April the 21. 1809

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honorable Reverdy G. Bowie,
Lewis Duval and Benjamin Hodges.

By the Petition of Benedict Wade accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of Anne Arundel County Court it appears that he was fined at April Term instant in two Cases the sum of six pounds Current Money in each case for selling less than a Pint of spirituous liquor under a retail licence. The Petitioner states that he is a poor Man without any aid but his own personal labor. that he rented a small lot of land on the public Road and built a House thereon and kept a small Grocery store and obtained a retail licence to sell spirituous liquor. that some poor Travellers who wanted a little refreshment would persuade him to sell them a drink in one of these instances he has been presented. that as soon as he learned that he was presented, he broke up his store and sold no more liquor under his licence or in any other manner. that he has been incapable of doing any thing for several Months in consequence of an accidental wound which he received in the Winter and that he is unable to pay the fines. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
