By the Petition of Edward Hamilton accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Charles County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March Term eighteen hundred and eight the sum of sixty Dollars for assaulting Alexander Bateman. The Petitioner states that at August Term eighteen hundred and eight he appeared before the Jury in a Civil Suit to answer the said Bateman as to the injury done him, and that the Jury upon a full hearing of all the evidence in the cause gave damages only to the amount of five shillings and seven pence half penny. The Board in consideration of which circumstance and the deposition of Samuel Beckell and William Acton do remit the sum of forty Dollars of the said fine.

On Application of Peter Mantz of Frederick County for a preference in the purchase of a small slice of land being part of a Tract of Land called Taskers Chance in Frederick County late the property of Daniel Dulany, and which is subject to Confiscation. Beginning for the aforesaid slice of land part of the tract called Taskers Chance aforesaid at the end of the first line of a Tract of Land called Dear Hong, late the property of Sebastian Dem. being also a part of Taskers Chance, and running thence with said land, as the same hath lately been surveyed and run out by an allowance of four degrees for variation. The two following Courses and distances to wit South sixty seven degrees East seventy six Perches, South forty nine degrees East forty Perches to Monocacy River, then up by and with the Meanders of said River the four following Courses and distances to wit North thirty six degrees West sixteen Perches, North fifty three degrees West thirty six Perches, North fifty eight degrees West twenty eight Perches, North two and a half degrees West forty two Perches then by a straight line to the beginning containing one acre. The Board agreed to sell the States right to said land for the sum of eight pounds. The money paid and Deed given.
