Wednesday August the 23-1809

The Council met Present The Honorable Reverdy G. Hise, Lewis Duvall and Thomas W. Hall.

By The Petition of Thomas Melly accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for Baltimore County it appears that he was recognized to attend the said Court to give testimony against James Cook at September Term eighteen hundred and seven. That he did attend several Courts, and was informed by the Clerk and other officers of the Court that there was no occasion for his coming again to Court as Cook had a license and could not be arrested. That at January last said Cook was arrested and the Petitioner's Recognizance forfeited for his not then attending the Court of all which the Petitioner living remote in the County and in obscure life was totally ignorant and now is in custody of the Sheriff upon an execution issued on the said forfeiture. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture.

By the Petition of Henry Zagler of Frederick County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that at August Term eighteen hundred and seven he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of one hundred Dollars for the appearance of a certain William Rankin to answer for committing an assault and Battery on the body of Peter Engle Junior. The Petitioner states that soon after the said Rankin runaway and at February Court eighteen hundred and nine the said Recognizance was forfeited. That he is a very poor man with a large family, and if compelled to pay the amount of said forfeiture it will totally ruin him. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture.
