Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Robert Welch of Ben the sum of twenty five Dollars and ten cents it being the balance of his account for examining and returning to a True Bill as above the four thousand stand of arms belonging to the State.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain James Summers the sum of twenty two pounds ten shillings for one quarters half pay due the first day of August last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Rebecca Frost the sum of twenty three pounds fifteen shillings for one quarters half pay due as above.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William T. Green the sum of forty one Dollars and seventy five cents as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mrs. Subb Fowler the sum of two hundred Dollars to purchase wood for the use of the Legislature.

By the Petition of Thomas Charles of Harford County it appears that he was fined at August Term last for selling spirituous liquors without license. The Petitioner states that a certain George G. Presbury and Joseph Davis Senior were in copartnership in the mercantile line and in selling liquors that said Presbury was in fact from the active partners and that he took out license for one year from August Term eighteen hundred and eight in the name of Presbury and Davis that in the month of March eighteen hundred and nine Davis becoming sick of said business relinquished it and the said Presbury took the Petitioner into partnership with him in the place and stead of said Davis.
