The State of Maryland to Wit. To all whom it may concern. Frederick William Bruene Esquire, having produced to the Governor an Exequatur, signed by the President of the United States, and sealed with the Seal of the said States, recognizing him as Vice Consul from his Danish Majesty for the State of Maryland, to reside at Baltimore. ordered by and with the advice and consent of the Council, that the said Recognition be published for the information and government of the people of this State. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis, under the Seal of the State of Maryland, the nineteenth day of September, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine, and of the Independence of the United States of America the thirty fourth.

Whereas it has been made to appear to me that Frederick William Bruene Esquire, has been temporarily appointed Vice Consul of his Danish Majesty for the State of Maryland, to reside at Baltimore, I do therefore recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges, as are allowed to Vice Consuls of such friendly powers, between whom and the United States there is no particular agreement for the regulation
