

Friday November the 3. 1809

His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable Reverdy G. Lincoln Lewis Duwall Thomas W. Hall and Benjamin Hodges appeared

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honorable Thomas W. Hall the sum of fifty pounds for one quarters salary as a Member of the Council due the first Instant.

Saturday November the 4. 1809

Monday November the 6. 1809

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable Reverdy G. Lincoln Lewis Duwall Thomas W. Hall and Benjamin Hodges.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Jubb Fowler the sum of thirty nine pounds one shilling and three pence for one quarters salary as Messenger of the Council and Keeper of the Court House due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Jubb Fowler the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars to purchase wood for the General Assembly and to be by him accounted for.

Tuesday November the 7. 1809

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable Reverdy G. Lincoln Lewis Duwall Thomas W. Hall and Benjamin Hodges

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain John Coates the sum of one hundred Dollars for fifteen Months salary as Armourer at Eastern due the first Instant.

By the Petition of Jeremiah A. Neale accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Saint Marys County it appears that he together with Michael Boorman and Hnatie Smoot entered into a Recognizance for the appearance of the said Jeremiah A. Neale at March Term eighteen hundred and nine and good behavior. The Petitioner states that previous to the time limited for his appearance he removed to the District of Columbia and never has committed any offence which forfeited his Recognizance. that not being able to attend at the sitting of Charles County Court he wrote a letter directed to Clement Dorsey Esquire requesting him to state these circumstances to the Court, in order that the said Recognizance might be dismissed. that the said Clement Dorsey informed the Petitioner that he did read the said letter to the Court and that the said Court did direct a dismissal of the said Recognizance but that the Clerk owing to an unusual press of business omitted to do so. that his appearance by his Counsel from the said cause was not entered on the said Recognizance, but the same was forfeited and execution issued. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court said County do remit the said Recognizance
