

hundred Dollars to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring to Justice Negro Perry, John and Stephen who lately made their escape from Queen Anne's County Gaol or one hundred Dollars for either of them.

Ordered that His Excellency the Governor be authorized to offer a Reward of two hundred Dollars to any person who will discover the person or persons who set fire to Mr. James McGillicuddy's Tobacco House.

By the Petition of John Fitzgeral of Anne Arundel County it appears that he was presented at Anne Arundel County Court at September Term last in three several cases for selling Spirituous Liquor without Licence and fined the sum of six pounds five shillings in each case. The Petitioner states that he is in indigent and needy circumstances and on account of his ignorance of the law did act contrary to what he finds to be legal and right. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from their recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine. Thomas W. Hall

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Robert Welch Jun. out of the Contingent Fund the sum of twenty nine Dollars and thirty seven cents for riding expenses to the Sheriff of Queen Anne's County by order of His Excellency the Governor as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mrs. Betty Summers the sum of four pounds seventeen Shillings and six pence for six months pay for cleaning the Public Necessary due the first instant.

Ordered that the Proceedings of the Council shall be regularly entered on a Journal each day and that on the succeeding day previous to any other act, the same shall be read over by the Clerk, and signed by the Governor, or the Member of the Council presiding before which any Member of the Board may move to reconsider any part thereof which may not have been carried into execution, and the same shall be considered as subject to alteration by a subsequent vote of the Council.

The Council took into consideration the appointment of Justices of the Peace and other officers directed by the Constitution and Laws to be appointed annually and not having come to a conclusion postponed the further consideration thereof till to morrow.
