Wednesday December the 13-1809

The Honourable James Butcher a Councilman elect appeared in the Council Room, and was qualified as such agreeably to the Constitution and laws of this State before Joseph Sanding a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking repeating and subscribing the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose as well as the Oath of support to the Government of the United States. The Council met. Present The Honourable James Butcher, Thomas W. Hall, Reverdy G. Fiske and Lewis Duvall.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Honourable James Butcher the sum of thirty three pounds six shillings and eight pence for two Months salary as a Member of the Council due the first day of November last.
