Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Messrs. Houston and  
Ridge by the sum of one hundred Dollars each out of the Contingent Fund as an additional  
fee for defending four suits in Chancery against the State in which the Attorney General  
had been employed by the Plaintiffs previous to his appointment to that office and for  
attending to the same in the Court of Appeals.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Thomas King out of  
the Contingent Fund the sum of forty three Dollars and seventy five cents for five  
days board of the Indians as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered that the thirty Rifles contracted for by Captain William Woodland  
for the use of his Company be received and paid for by the Executive as the property of  
the State, provided that he give Bond and Security for their safe keeping and return  
when called for and have Maryland stamped on them.

George Brent was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Charles County and  
Commissioner issued to Walter Dyer Benjamin Cortee Doctor Samuel Hanson John  
Digges Ignatius Middleton Benjamin Douglas Robert Cramie Gerard Buscoe  
Samuel Hawkins Thomas Rogerson John Lowrey Daniel Smallwood George H.  
Spalding William Brawner Luke F. Matthews Thomas Price James Neale of  
Bennett William Jackson Richard Speake Benjamin F. Fendall John W.  
McPherson Hezekiah Garner Henry Hagan Samuel Ogden William Wood
