

By the Petition of Thomas Dent and Samuel Amory Junor of Charles County it appears that they entered into a Recognizance at the Court of the said County at August Term eighteen hundred and seven for the appearance of the said Thomas Dent at March Term eighteen hundred and eight to answer a presentment for committing an Assault and Battery on the body of Anthony Levee. that at March Term eighteen hundred and eight the Petitioner Thomas Dent was confined to his Bed by a severe indisposition and at August Term next succeeding he filed an affidavit for the continuance of the said case in which he expected and was informed by his Counsel, the said Recognizance would be respited, but to his great disappointment after having appeared in the Court and filed his affidavit, he learnt his Recognizance was forfeited tho' not till he was called on for the amount thereof. The Petitioner Thomas Dent solemnly declares that he never meant or intended in any manner to evade a trial on the presentment found against him and that the payment of the sum so as a foreraid forfeited would seriously distress him. The Board on consideration of the circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture
