Ordered that Joseph Ennalls and John Eccleston, as Securities to William Ennalls for a debt due the State of Maryland, be indulged until the meeting of the next General Assembly agreeably to a Resolution passed at November Session eighteen hundred and nine.

Ordered that indulgence be granted Joseph Ennalls as a State debtor, likewise as Security with the other Security of Mrs. Hudson until the meeting of the next General Assembly he or they complying with the terms of the Resolution of November Session eighteen hundred and nine.

Ordered that Henry Haskins and his Securities be indulged until the meeting of the next General Assembly he or they complying with the terms of a Resolution passed at November Session in the Year eighteen hundred and nine.

Ordered that the Attorney General be and he is hereby requested to endeavour to procure as early a decision as possible of State Claims in the Court of Chancery, there being several Injunctions obtained in said Court preventing the collection of State Debts, and many of them of long standing.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Frederick Green Esquire, thirty pounds and eleven pence as per Account passed by the Auditor General.
