Roger Nelson Esquire was appointed an Associate Judge of the fifth Judicial District  
in the room of William Claiborne Esquire deceased and Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that Andrew Slicer and Thomas Brown be employed to do the Carpenters work  
in the necessary Repairs to the State House on the outside, and for each good and sufficient  
Carpenter to be allowed one Dollar and sixty six and two thirds Cents per day and for each  
of themselves two Dollars per day and for necessary Materials on the amount ten per Cent  
Commission together with an allowance for travelling expenses while procuring said  
Materials.

Ordered that William and Washington G. Tuck be employed to put up conve-  
nient places in the State House for the reception and safe keeping of the Cannon and  
small Arms, and that either of themselves be allowed fifteen shillings per day, and for  
each good and sufficient Carpenter eleven shillings and three pence per day, and  
that the said Messieurs Tucks be allowed ten per Cent Commission on the plasterwork  
or Brick layer's bill for superintending.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Merian Conkney the sum  
of Seventy five pounds for one quarters Salary as Clerk of the Council due the first day  
of May Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mrs. Rebecca Foster  
Dollars for a quarters half pay due the first day of May Instant.
