Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain James
Bruff the sum of twenty two pounds ten Shillings for one quarters half pay due

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Isaac Holland the
sum of two Dollars and fifty cents as per account passed by the Auditor General.

County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Oyer
and Terminer and Goal Delivery for the said County it appears that a certain
John Heninger was fined at September Term eighteen hundred and eight

ily dependant on him for support and that he is unable to pay the same. The
Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of
the Court of the said County do remit the said fine of six pounds.
