

By the Petition of David Horn of Washington County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March Term last the Sum of fifteen pounds Current Money for building and keeping up a Fish Dam across the Potomac River. The Petitioner states that he did erect a Fish Cot in the said River Potomac, but it was at a time of low Water when no Boats could navigate the same and that he removed the said obstruction before the Water of the River had risen so as to admit Boats to ascend or descend the River and that in reality no Boat whatever was or could have been in the least obstructed by reason of said erection and that at the time he erected the Fish Cot he was under the impression that no injury could possibly arise from it to any person whatever. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit that part of the said fine to which the State is entitled to.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain James Bruss the Sum of twenty two pounds ten shillings for one quarters half pay due the first day of November last.

By the Petition of Walter Edelen Executor of Electus Edelen and John Manning it appears that the said Electus Edelen and John Manning entered into Recognizances to the amount of sixty pounds in the whole for the appearance of a certain George Groves at Prince Georges County Court at April Term eighteen hundred and eight to answer presentments for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioners state that the said George Groves acted as Clerk to the said Electus Edelen and as such sold the liquors for which he was presented and that the said Electus Edelen had a licence from the Court of the said County authorizing him to retail liquors at the time for which the said Groves was presented. That the payment of the said forfeitures would much injure the Estate of Electus Edelen and injure the Petitioners John Manning. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit said forfeitures.
