

County it appears that they entered into a Bail Bond in the penal sum of one hundred pounds current Money for the appearance of the said Regim Simpson at October Term eighteen hundred and seven to answer a presentment for selling Spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioners state that the Petitioner Regim Simpson was sick and unable to attend the Court at the said Term agreeably to the tenour of the Bail Bond and that the same was respited until the next Term - that the Petitioner Regim Simpson did attend at the said Term and being ignorant how to proceed applied to Mr Perry one of the Attorneys of the said Court to direct him - that soon afterwards Mr Perry was taken sick and unable to attend Court - that the Petitioner Regim Simpson having waited several days without being called concluded that what was necessary had been done by Mr Perry and accordingly went home. that Judgment has been obtained on said Bond. The Petitioners state that the said Regim Simpson served as a Soldier during the whole of the Revolutionary War and is at this time disabled by an injury he received in the service of his Country - that he has a Wife and Child to provide for and that he is unable to pay the amount of said forfeiture. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture of one hundred pounds.
