

of gambling. The Petitioner states that it did not appear in evidence upon the trial of this case that he had ever established a Faro Table, or had any particular house or room to which persons might resort for the purpose of gaming. That he was proved to have been sometimes seen at play in the Taverns at Traders Town, but it was also proved that he was a lawyer in a private room, and in the most select bar parlors of gentlemen. That he had frequently been invited by the most genteel society of the Town to take a game at cards, with whose request he often complied without supposing that what was innocent in others could be criminal in him. The Petitioner states that no one except himself has been noticed as a violator of the law. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
