in your County of Allegany for a Representative of this State to fill the Vacancy in the House of  
Representatives of the United States occasioned by the Resignation of the aforesaid Roger Nelson  
Esquire, and the said Election shall be held within fifteen days after the receipt of this Warrant  
and you shall serve a copy thereof on each of the Judges in each Election District of your County  
at least three days before the day appointed for holding such Election. Given in Council at the  
City of Annapolis under the Seal of the State of Maryland this seventh day of September  
in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten.

Room from this day to Monday the seventeenth Instant.

Tuesday September the 18/1810

The Council met Present The Honourable Reverdy G. Hiselein Thomas W. Hall and Lewis  
Duvall.

Cornelius Howard Esquire was appointed a Justice of the Superior Court for Baltimore  
County vice Thomas Dickson Esquire deceased and Commission issued to George G. Presbury  
Jesse Dancy and Cornelius Howard Esquire as Justices of the Superior Court for said County.  
By the Petition of Sarah Wade of Cecil County accompanied by a Representation of the  
Court of the said County it appears that she was fined by the said Court at September Term  
eighteen hundred and ten the sum of six pounds for selling liquors without licence. The  
Court state that they believe that the said Sarah Wade violated the law through ignorance.  
The Board on consideration of which circumstance and from the recommendation of the Court  
of the said County do remit the said fine.
