

Monday October the 8 1810

The Council met. Present The Honourable Reverdy G. Hiselein, Thomas W. Hall and Lewis Duwall

By The Petition of John Isaac of Anne Arundel County it appears that at September Term last he was presented for an assault and Battery charged to have been committed on Joseph Maguire and upon submission was fined by Anne Arundel County Court in the Sum of twenty Dollars. The Petitioner states that he was innocent of the charge alleged against him, and is unable to discharge the fine. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the recommendation of a number of respectable persons in habitants of the said County do remit the said fine of twenty Dollars.

Monday October the 15 1810

The Council met. Present The Honourable Reverdy G. Hiselein, Thomas W. Hall and Lewis Duwall.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Messieurs Andrew Plier and Thomas Brown the Sum of one thousand Dollars it being the amount of their account against the State for Repairs to the Dome of the State House as per account passed by the Auditor.

The Board being in possession of the Returns from the Counties of Washington and Allegany and the Upper part of Frederick County of an election held for the choice of a Representative of the fourth District in the Congress of the United States to supply the Vacancy occasioned by the Resignation of the Honourable Roger Nelson by which it appears that the honourable Samuel Ringgold was elected. Therefore it is declared that the said Samuel Ringgold is duly elected a Representative of this State in the Congress of the United States. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland this fifteenth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten, and of the Independence of the United States of America the thirty fifth.
