The Honorable George E. Mitchell a Counsellor elect appeared in the Council Room and was qualified as such according to the Constitution and Laws of this State before James Boyle Esquire one of the Clerks of the Court for the City of Annapolis by taking repeating and subscribing the federal Oath and the declaration prescribed for that purpose as well as the Oath of Allegiance to the Government of the United States.
