By the Petition of Walter McConchie of Charles County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of twenty pounds for his appearance at the Court of the said County at March Term eighteen hundred and ten to answer a presentment for an assault and Battery on the Body of Jesse B. The Petitioner states that he did attend the Court during the whole Term at March Term 1810, and made frequent applications to the Prosecutor to have his case disposed of; but was always told by him that nothing could be done, until the Witness Palmer should attend the Court. He further states that Palmer is a Resident of Virginia, as he is informed, and did not appear at Court during the said Term - that through ignorance he neglected to have his Recognizance respited until the next Term and it was thereby forfeited to the State. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeiture of twenty pounds.

By the Petition of Edward Digges of Charles County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that at March Term 1809 a Presentment was found against him for an assault upon the Body of Raphael Boorman, that he appeared at August Term 1809 for his trial, and was anxious and pressing for it but was denied his trial on account of the absence of the State's Witness, whose attendance could not be procured during the Term. that he then entered into a Recognizance in the sum of twenty pounds Current Money with William Penn his Security for his appearance at March Term 1810 to answer the said Presentment. that at March Term 1810, the extreme indisposition of his Wife, who was then upon a visit in a distant County of the State, demanded his personal attendance, and he was from that circumstance prevented from attending as necessary to the term of his Recognizance.
