The Council met. Present His Excellency The Governor and The Honorable John Stephen, James Butcher, Reverdy G. Huie, George E. Mitchell and Tho. W. Hace

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonathan Pinney Esquire Cashier of the Farmers Bank of Maryland the Sum of two thousand Dollars to be by him placed to the credit of Perry Benson, George Smith and Benjamin Wilnot the Commissioners appointed by the Legislature at its last sitting to repair or rebuild under the direction of the Executive the whole or such parts of the Armoury at Eastern in Talbot County as may be necessary for the reception and safe keeping of the Public Arms and Military Stores and to be by them accounted for.

The Board proceeded to the appointment of an Associate Justice of the Third District of this State to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of Henry Ridgely Esquire. The Ballot Box was prepared, the Ballots deposited therein, and on examination thereof it appeared that Richard Ridgely Esquire had a Majority of Votes. Whereupon it is declared in Council that the said Richard Ridgely is duly elected Associate Justice of the Third District. Ordered that Commission issue to him. Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William S. Green Esquire Administrator of Frederick Green the Sum of sixty one Dollars as per accounts passed and lodged with the Auditor.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Andrew Pleece the Sum of one hundred Dollars to be by him accounted for.
