The Petitioner states that being unwell last Fall and wishing to renew his license as a Tavern Keeper he applied to Mr. John Hutcheson who called at his House when going about the county electioning for Sheriff and requested him to get his license renewed when he returned to the city and paid him the necessary sum for renewing the same but from his long stay in the county when he arrived in Town the Court had adjourned so that he could not obtain it or send the Petitioner word until after the said liquor was sold. The Petitioner states that he is poor and has seven small children to support by his own industry. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for Baltimore County do remit the whole of the said fines.

By the Petition of William King of Baltimore County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for said County it appears that he was fined in two cases by the said Court at July Term eighteen hundred and eleven the sum of ten Dollars in each case the one for assaulting and beating Sarah Burnett the other for assaulting and beating Ann Dove. The Petitioner states that he is wholly unable to pay the said fines. That he has a Wife and seven small children who are entirely dependent on his daily labour, as a brick layer for their support. The Petitioner states that should the fines not be remitted he must go to Jail and his Wife and children would be under the necessity of having recourse to the humanity of the Citizens of Baltimore and would suffer extremely by the inclemency of the approaching season. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of a Number of respectable persons inhabitants of the said County do remit the whole of the said fines.

By the Petition of John Montgomery accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of Charles County Court it appears that he was fined by the said Court at August Term last the sum of six pounds Current Money for selling Brandy less than a Quart. The Petitioner states that he was informed by his Neighbours that he might sell his own distilled liquor and did not know that he was not permitted to sell less than a Quart. That he had no intention of transgressing the laws and sold the pint of spirit under the impression that it was correct and lawful for him to do so. That he is poor and has a Wife and two small children to support. The Board in consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.
