Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Henry S. Hall the sum of thirty one Dollars and six cents for going in preference to the Sheriffs of Harford and Cecil Counties with Writs of Election as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. David Hamlen the sum of twenty five Dollars and forty three cents for riding Express to the Sheriff of Kent County with a writ of Election as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. William Smith the sum of two Dollars as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council make application to Mr. Henry Foxall for two six pound Iron Field Pieces to be delivered at Annapolis as early as possible.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William P. Ridgaway Esq. Sheriff of Queen Annes County the sum of forty six Dollars and twenty nine cents in full of his allowance and expenses for bringing from the State of Delaware Edward Collins a fugitive from the Justice of this State.
