

John Stinson called John Cunningham who fled from the Justice of the Peace  
in November 1811 Cunningham was named and a name was demanded from the Governor  
of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Joseph Lewis was appointed  
agent to receive him

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Union should pay to William Cunningham  
eight dollars and seventy five cents as per account rendered.
